She is particularly interested in the status and meaning of religious experience, and is the author of numerous articles and anthology chapters that variously work at the intersections of Christian theology with Native American religious traditions and race, sexuality, postcolonial, and gender theories. Her current research continues these interests in the areas of comparative epistemology, theopoetics, and incarnation.
